

## ZOE ZENIODI CONDUCTOR

Zoe Zeniodi, Artistic Director of the Thessaloniki Concert Hall in Greece, recently conducted the Bogota Philharmonic in concerts with Stephen Hough and Lise de la Salle. She had her Carnegie Hall debut in 2017 and is the first woman to conduct at Opera Southwest ("I Pagliacci" 2017). She has been a Fellow of the Hart Institute of Women Conductors at The Dallas Opera since 2016 where she has taken part in concerts and workshops with The Dallas Opera, San Francisco Opera, and Juilliard School of Music. She is the Principal Conductor of the Greek-Turkish Youth Orchestra, the Principal Guest Conductor for "Asia-Europe" New Music Festival in Hanoi, Vietnam, and the Artistic Advisor of the Festival of the Aegean and Artistic Director of "Consonances" annual music series for the Onassis Foundation Scholars' Association. Current projects for the 2019-2020 season include *The Merry Widow* with the Athens Symphony Orchestra, a concert with the Missoula Symphony, and *Le nozze di Figaro* with New Zealand Opera.



Zoe has conducted opera and ballet productions at Florida Grand Opera, Opera Southwest, Greek National Opera, Onassis Cultural Center, Festival of the Aegean, and the University of Miami. In concert and recording, she has conducted the Bogota Philharmonic, Tatarstan National Symphony Orchestra, Tokyo Star Symphony Orchestra, Vietnam National Symphony Orchestra, Brno Philharmonic, South Czech Philharmonic, Orchestra Classica Toscana, New England Symphonic Ensemble, Palm Beach Symphony, New Florida Philharmonic, St. Hugh Symphony Orchestra, Thessaloniki State Orchestra, Greek Radio Symphony Orchestra, Camerata Athens, Thessaloniki Symphony Orchestra, ARTeffects Ensemble, Ensemble 21, JONDE, Youth Orchestra of Colombia, Greater Miami Youth Symphony, and Florida Youth Orchestra, among others.

Previous positions include Chief Conductor of MOYSA, Assistant/Cover Conductor for Florida Grand Opera, Music and Artistic Director of Broward Symphony Orchestra and Alhambra Orchestra, Associate Music Director of the Festival of the Aegean, and Associate Conductor of Frost Symphony Orchestra. She has recorded for the Greek National Radio, both as a conductor (championing contemporary music by Greek composers) and a pianist. She has released 6 recordings of American contemporary music, including most of Thomas Sleeper's world premieres and Frank Ticheli's master song-cycle "An American Dream" (Albany Records, Uroboros Music and Puzzlemusik). She has taken part in prestigious master courses where she has conducted the Cleveland Orchestra and the Stockholm Sinfonietta.

As a pianist, Zoe has appeared in major concert halls and festivals in England (Royal Festival Hall, St. John's Smith Square, St. James's Piccadilly), France (Montpellier Festival, Guibwiller Festival), Germany (Frankfurt Oper, Rheinsberg Festival, Halle, Kiel, Leipzig, Düsseldorf, Dortmund, Berlin, Cologne), Croatia (Lisinski Concert Hall), Russia (Kazan Tchaikovsky Hall), Austria (Wienersaal Salzburg), Belgium (European Union Hall), Holland (Embassy Concerts), Greece (National Opera, Athens and Thessaloniki concerts halls, Samos, Casa dei Mezzo, Koroni, Chios, Kefalonia, Chania Festivals), Italy, Venezuela, Mauritius, and the USA. In 2003, she was named a Junior Fellow in Piano Accompaniment at the Royal College of Music where she also won all the piano accompaniment prizes and competitions during her studies. She has worked as a coach for singers at the Britten-Pears Young Artist Programme, Nice Summer Academy, Mozarteum University and Summer Academy, Abingdon School for Singers, Greek National Opera, Florida Grand Opera, Royal College of Music, Greek National Conservatory, Amici della Musica, and the University of Miami, among others.

Zoe holds a DMA and an Artist Diploma in Orchestral Conducting from the University of Miami. She studied piano and collaborative piano at the Royal College of Music in London and at the Mozarteum University in Salzburg, earning her Master and Bachelor degrees, as well as postgraduate and advanced postgraduate diplomas. During her studies, she received scholarships and grants from the Alexandros Onassis Foundation, the Friends of Music Society, the Propondis Foundation, the Royal College of Music, and the University of Miami.
